# INTRODUCTION

# **DISCUSS**

#### READ

Luke 13:18-21

# **EXPLAIN**

The kingdom Jesus is excited about is the space where God is in charge. It's where He's acknowledged as King. The analogies Jesus uses suggest that the kingdom might initially looks small and unimpressive (like the seed or the yeast) but end up being large (like a mustard tree) and influential (like yeast in dough). In our world, the

kingdom of God might often look weak and unimpressive. But it will not always be that way. History is building towards the day when God's rule over everything is fully realised.

# **DISCUSS**

- 3. How would you describe the 'kingdom' Jesus is talking about in your own words?
- 4. How might we know when it is present or prevalent in our lives?
- 5. What do you think it means to make a 'kingdom' decision?

### **READ**

Matthew 28:16-20

#### **EXPLAIN**

These words have been called the greatest commission with the greatest scope given by

the greatest person who ever lived. The Great Commission is central to what God's doing, bringing people to himself and growing them to love Him more and live in His ways. This great call is surrounded by Jesus' promises that He has all authority and is always with us.

#### **DISCUSS**

- 7. What do you think it might mean to make decisions in light of the Great Commission in your own life and circumstances?

#### READ

Colossians 1:9-12





#### **EXPLAIN**

Paul's prayers have a purpose in mind - that knowing God's will would completely transform the character of his friends.
